MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 13 NOTEBOOK

PASSPORT STAMPED (BOWL-ELIGIBLE TEAMS): C-USA (6): FIU (8-3) Louisiana Tech (7-3), Marshall (7-3), Middle Tennessee (7-4), North Texas (8-3), UAB (9-2); MAC (7): Buffalo (9-2), Eastern Michigan (6-5), Miami (6-6), Northern Illinois (7-4), Ohio (7-4), Toledo (6-5), Western Michigan (6-5). WEEK 13 PREVIEW: Tuesday, the final midweek MACtion games took place as Miami reached bowl eligibility with a 42-21 victory over Ball State, and Western Michigan beat MAC West champ Northern Illinois 28-21. Friday, the MAC completes its' regular-season schedule Friday as Buffalo tries to wrap up the MAC East as the Bulls travel to Bowling Green. A victory gives the Bulls the East Division title, but a Buffalo loss, coupled with Miami's Tuesday victory over Ball State and a Ohio home victory over Akron, gives Miami the MAC East title and a date with Northern Illinois in the Marathon MAC Championship Game on November 30.

Also Friday, Central Michigan is at Toledo and Eastern Michigan travels to Kent State.

Saturday, there are seven Conference USA games, with the two biggest being Marshall at FIU and UAB at Middle Tennessee. A FIU victory gives the Panthers the East Division title outright. A FIU loss, and a Middle Tennessee victory over UAB gives the Blue Raiders the East title. UAB is the West champion, and can host the Conference USA Championship Game on December 1 with a victory over MTSU. A FIU victory and a Middle Tennessee victory gives FIU the East title and the C-USA title game host will be determined by College Football Playoff rankings first, and if neither FIU or UAB is in the CFP top 25, the host will be decided by average computer ranking.

Also Saturday, Florida Atlantic needs a home victory over Charlotte to gain bowl eligibility, and Southern Miss also needs a victory at UTEP to be bowl eligible. In other games, WKU is at Louisiana Tech, Old Dominion travels to Rice, and North Texas plays in-state rival UTSA.

IN THE POLLS: In Conference USA, UAB (9-2 overall, 7-0 C-USA), and in the MAC, Buffalo (9-2, 6-1 MAC) are receiving votes in both the Associated Press and the Amway Coaches polls.

MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (**PlayStation Fiesta Bowl** or **Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl** for the 2018 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2018 season, as well as two secondary agreements: The Makers Wanted Bahamas, Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, Hawai'i, R+L Carriers New Orleans and either the Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla or the SERVPRO First Responder Bowls are primary agreements. The Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La., is a secondary agreement (should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team), as is the DXL Frisco Bowl. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

The MAC has 2018 primary bowl tie-ins with **Makers Wanted Bahamas**, **Dollar General**, **Famous Idaho Potato** and **Raycom Media Camellia Bowls**. The MAC has secondary 2018 bowl agreements with the **Quick Lane Bowl** (should the ACC or Big Ten not be able to provide a bowleligible team), the **DXL Frisco Bowl** and other ESPN owned/operated bowl games.

The **2018 Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl** participants – selected from among bowleligible teams in Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference – will be announced by the bowl, ESPN Events and conference partners once finalized.
